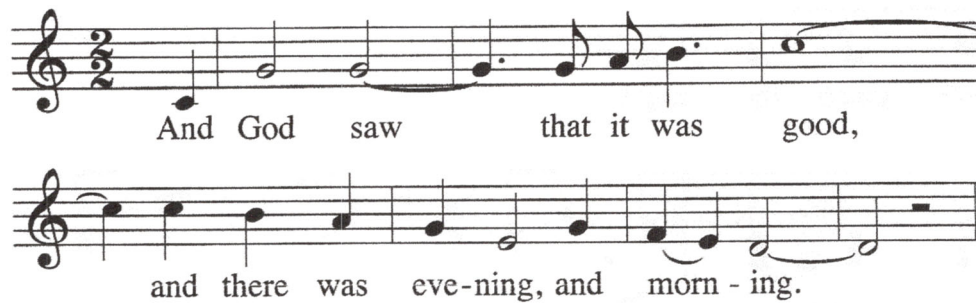

The First Day

God said, "I command light to shine!" And light started shining. God looked at the light and saw that it was good. He separated light from darkness and named the light "Day" and the darkness "Night."

The Fourth Day

Then he gave the living creatures his blessing—he told the ocean creatures to increase and live everywhere in the ocean and the birds to live everywhere on earth.

The Sixth Day

So God created humans to

be like himself; he made men and women. God gave them his blessing and said: Have a lot of children! Fill the earth with people and bring it under your control. Rule over the fish in the ocean, the birds in the sky, and every animal on the earth. I have provided all kinds of fruit and grain for you to eat. And I have given the green plants as food for everything else that breathes, including animals, both wild and tame, and birds.




